

MSTF Celebrates BRA Day







Mid-South Transplant Foundation hosted its first BRA (**B**reast **R**econstruction **A**wareness) Day on Oct. 24. BRA Day is a campaign designed to promote public education, patient care and research. It was first launched in 2011 and now occurs annually in October.

Donated tissue can play an important role in breast reconstruction surgery following a mastectomy. "Donor heroes offer hope and healing for breast cancer survivors," said Mary Beck, MSTF Community Relations
Coordinator and event organizer. "Tissue from one donor can help up to 10 patients undergoing breast reconstruction."

BRA Day at MSTF featured a bra decorating contest, tissue trivia and food from The Green Beetle and Mempops. In collaboration with Making Strides Against Breast Cancer (American Cancer Society), the Pink Chair was also part of the event. BRA Day was open not only to MSTF employees but also to other individuals and organizations in the MSTF office complex, Ambassadors and anyone else interested in participating.

First-, second- and third-place MSTF bra decorating contest winners, in order, were Rene Miller, Tissue Recovery Technician, for Keep the Rack Intact; Randa Lipman, Manager of Community Outreach, for Save the Boo Bees; and Tina Ray, Supervisor of Organ Recovery Technicians and Kidney Perfusion, for Barbells for Ruth.

Tissue donation improves the lives of others through gifts of corneas, heart valves, skin, bones, veins, tendons and cartilage. A single tissue donor can impact the quality of life for more than 75 individuals.

Each year, MSTF recognizes individual Ambassadors who go above and beyond in their efforts to support donation. The prestigious

Britt Award is Shemeka Malone. Malone is a donor family member. She is also a volunteer for other organizations, including the American Red Cross and UPS Women of Brown. When the call goes out for help, Malone finds time to make a difference.

The Ambassador of the Year (AOTY) Award is based largely, though not solely, on volunteer hours. The AOTY winner must exemplify commitment to the donation community. The 2024 AOTY honoree is Vera Milam Johnson. Milam Johnson works to build relationships with MSTF's driver's licensing partners in the six Arkansas counties served by MSTF.

Duck Campaign Flies High

Donate Life Tennessee's Donation Duck Campaign was the recipient of the 2024 Donate Life America (DLA) Pinnacle Award in the Fundraising Category. The campaign also received a Best of the Best Award for Best Return on Effort.

The Pinnacle Awards presentation was part of the DLA Annual Conference in October in Louisville, KY. Each year, DLA recognizes innovative and successful programs from Donate Life State Teams and their member organizations.

The Donate Life Tennessee (DLTN) Donation Duck campaign successfully raised awareness for organ, eye and tissue donation, re-energized DLTN's partnership with Tennessee county clerks and increased donations to the Tennessee County Clerk Organ Donation Awareness Foundation (TCCODAF). TCCODAF funds the DLTN donor registry and donation education throughout the state.

More than 60 of Tennessee's 95 county clerks participated in the campaign, which sent thousands of Donation Ducks stickered with a direct registration ask to every corner of the state. Tennesseans contributing to the TCCODAF were offered a Donation Duck in appreciation for their donation, netting a 15% increase in contributions to the fund.

From the campaign's beginning in 2023 until present, 25,000 Donation Ducks have been distributed. A fourth flock of Donation Ducks will hatch this winter and take flight in early spring.
