Coffee & Conversations Program Creates Opportunities for Learning



August, National Minority Donor Awareness Month (NMDAM), was the perfect time for great coffee and meaningful conversations. On Aug. 21 Mid-South Transplant Foundation (MSTF) hosted its first Coffee & Conversations event at Cxffeeblack's second location at 3386 Bowen Ave. in Memphis.

The event was designed to foster discussion about the impact of donation and transplantation in the Mid-South community, honor NMDAM and encourage diversity. "We want everyone in our community to understand that donation affects them," said Mary Beck, MSTF Community Relations Coordinator. "It's a multicultural issue." About 60% of the 100,000 individuals on the national transplant waiting list are from racial and ethnic minority groups, according to July 2025 data from the Organ Procurement and Transplantation Network (OPTN).

Coffee & Conversations provided a safe space to talk about organ and tissue donation candidly, share transplant experiences, ask questions and learn new things. It also gave many attendees an opportunity to meet others who are walking similar paths in their experiences as recipients or donor family members.

Ambassadors Rockie Smith and Latrice McClinton, both double-lung recipients, were part of Coffee & Conversations.

"Coffee & Conversations was such a wonderful event," Smith said. "Seeing people who look like me being afforded the second chance (through donation) at continuing to impact those around us made my heart glad." She also expressed appreciation for the connections she made at the event with others who had "traveled the same transplant journey."

McClinton too remarked on the journey shared by those with links to transplant.
"Meeting others who have walked the journey of organ transplants – both recipients and a (living) donor – reminded me that we are all connected by resilience, gratitude and the gift of life."

"We appreciate everyone who was there for our first Coffee & Conversations," Beck said. "Good coffee with good conversation is a powerful partnership. We'll continue to look for ways to bring the community together on this topic."

It was founded in 2019 by a husband-and-wife team, Bartholomew Jones and Renata Henderson. Cxffeeblack is on a mission to return coffee to its African roots and became a trailblazer in the coffee industry by creating an all-Black coffee supply chain from Ethiopia to Memphis, according to the company's website.

NMDAM grew from National Minority Donor Awareness Week, founded in 1996 by the National Minority Organ Tissue Transplant Education Program (MOTTEP) and Clive Callender, M.D., to raise awareness about health disparities and the impact of organ donation and transplantation in minority communities.

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
